






A third of young people did not identify **Jersey** as their ethnic background.

a car available to the family when needed

one holiday or more away each year

3 Health and diet







Health

74% described their health as good or very good.

> 15% said they had a disability or long-term illness.

Sleep

45% reported getting **8 hours or** more sleep the previous night ...



...but only **23%** of year 12s achieved this.

Diet

1 in 4 consumed at least 5 portions of fruit or vegetables the previous day.

5-a-day

The amount of young people who ate 5 portions of fruit and vegetables went down as children got older from:





32% in Year 4

10% in Year 12.



Girls were more likely to eat fresh fruit, salads or vegetables 4 or more days a week.





Dental Hygiene

86% brushed their teeth at least twice the previous day.



85% have visited the dentist within the last year



... up from **80%** in 2021.



4 Leisure time and sport



Leisure time

90% reported enjoying spending time with their parents or carers.

20% of year 10s stayed outside their home past 10pm with no adult present at least weekly.

Physical activity

22% of young people did the NHS recommended level of physical activity.



Education



79% of Year 10 girls and **60%** of Year 10 boys want to continue full-time education.

34% of year 12 students wanted to go to university off-island and **not** return.



Careers



Boys in years 10 and 12
— more interested in Sport, leisure and culture, finance, and engineering.



Girls in years 10 and 12

— more interested in education and childcare, medical and social care, and art and design.

Influence



29% agree that their community would act on their ideas.



61% agree that adults in Jersey wanted to hear what young people had to say.

Children's Rights



73% have heard about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.

6 Smoking, alcohol and drugs





13% of year 8



Smoking

81% of year 10 **59%** of year 12's said they've never smoked.



Home life

24% said their parents smoked.

Passive smoking

6% said they've been in a car with someone smoking.

Vaping



60% of young people in year 12 have tried e-cigarettes... **25%** are using them.

More girls have used e-cigarettes than boys.

Alcohol

55% of young people have never consumed alcohol.



9% drink alcohol at least occasionally.

Use of social media



84% of year 12 students used a social networking site every day.


Online behaviour

37% of young people had sent messages to a stranger online.

33% of year 12 students had changed or removed settings on social media to gain more followers.

28% of year 12 had lied to their parents or carers about who they had spoken to online.





8 Self-esteem and wellbeing

Boys were happier than girls in all age groups.




Self-esteem

26% of year 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12 had low or medium-low self esteem.



Worrying

The number of young people worrying 'often' or 'every day' about the way they look increases with year group.

In Year 8, 10 and 12 the top 3 worries were:

Girls worried more than boys.

Self-harm

22% of young people from years 10 and 12 have thought about self-harm.



Girls were more than twice as likely to think about self-harm than boys.

Support



23% of young people get support said 'speaking to a professional' would help their mental health.



9 Bullying



Bullying at school

22% of young people reported having been bullied in the last 12 months.



1 in 10 year 4 children said they often or very often felt worried to go to school because of bullying.



Girls were more worried about going to school because of bullying than boys.

Does school take it seriously?

Nearly 6 in 10 year 6 children believed their school always took bullying seriously.



This decreased for years 8, 10 and 12 children.



Information

The top 5 ways to get information on sex came from:



sex education lessons



parents/ carers

Confidence to say no

11% of boys in year 8, 10 and 12 would 'probably give in' to sex they didn't want.



Girls in Year 8 and 10 were more likely than boys to **say 'no' to sex** they didn't want.

Sexually active

9% of Year 10 **36%** of Year 12 reported being currently or previously sexually active.



Contraception

87% in year 10 and 12 knew where to get free condoms...



...up from **70%** in 2021.

23% reported having unprotected sex.

Attraction



84% of boys



68% of girls

are attracted to the opposite sex.



11 Gender stereotypes





Attitudes to gender stereotypes

58% of **girls** strongly agree that it's fine for boys to play with dolls.



20% of **boys** strongly agree that it's fine for boys to play with dolls.

63% of **girls** strongly agree that it's fine for girls to play with trucks.



24% of **boys** strongly agree that it's fine for girls to play with trucks.

Gender roles

46% of girls strongly disagreed that men should take control in relationships...



... compared to 19% of boys.

91% agree that parents should have equal responsibility for raising children.





Scenarios

"A girl is getting ready for a night out. When her boyfriend sees she is dressed up more than usual, he says he doesn't like her going out looking like that and tells her to change."



50% of boys found the boys behaviour wrong or very wrong.



77% of girls found the boys behaviour wrong or very wrong.



"A group of boys wolf-whistle or cat-call as a girl walks past."

41% of boys found that behaviour wrong or very wrong.



63% of girls found that behaviour wrong or very wrong.



12 Police and crime



Police

74% of young people agreed that the police can be relied upon.

74%



67% agreed the police treat people fairly.

63% had confidence in the police.

Crime

1 in 13 said they were a victim of crime in the last year, with St Helier being the most likely place for the crime to happen.





Child sexual abuse

14% of young people in years 8, 10 and 12 reported knowing someone who has been a victim of child sexual abuse...



... less than half of young people said they would definitely tell someone if they'd been a victim.

Criminal exploitation

Most young people said they'd tell their parents if someone tried to exploit them. But...



15% of boys and
11% of girls
said they would probably not, or
definitely not tell someone if someone
was trying to criminally exploit them.
